

340B DRUG PRICING PROGRAM

The 340B Drug Pricing Program was created by Congress to provide relief from high drug costs – the program helps safety-net providers serving vulnerable communities stretch scarce federal resources to support essential services.

The program is paid for with drug discounts, not state or federal tax dollars

Drug company actions are undermining this critical program. Support Legislation Protecting Providers & Consumers from discriminatory policies

SB 1608 by Senator Brodeur

Create parity by **prohibiting** lower reimbursement to 340b providers than would be provided to non-340b providers

Reduce contract arrangements that **divert patients and drug savings away** from 340b providers

340B Providers

Non-profit/public providers that serve high numbers of low-income and uninsured patients. 340B providers include:

- Rural Hospitals
- Non-profit Hospitals
- Federally Qualified Health Centers
- Ryan White Grantees
- Certain Specialized Clinics (Hemophilia and TB)
