Hospital Funding Highlights

Graduate Medical Education

\$100 million to increase Statewide Medical Residencies

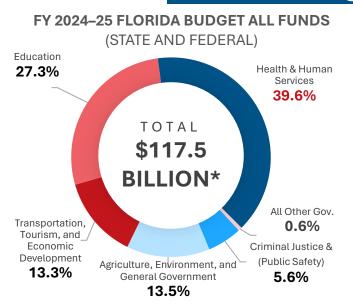

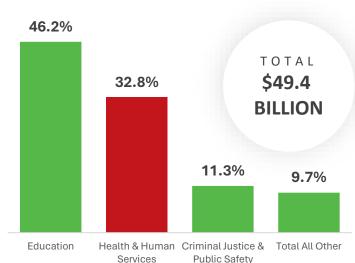

State Budget Overview



FY 2024–25 FLORIDA GENERAL REVENUE



The final budget approved by lawmakers and to be presented to the Governor totals \$117.5 B, of which \$49.4 B is general revenue. Please note – the Low-Income Pool, the Directed Payment Program, and other hospital supplemental payment programs authorized through budget amendments do not reflect in this total. Medicaid has been allocated \$33.4 B including \$10.9 B in general revenue. Health and Human Services represents 39.6% of all spending but only 32.8% of general revenue spending. The Education budget, by comparison, totals \$30.1 B including \$22.6 B in general revenue, making up 25.6% of all spending and a major 45.7% of general revenue spending.







Fiscal Year 2024-2025 State Budget



2024 was a historic year for Florida's Medicaid program. All too often in recent years, lawmakers have looked to cut Medicaid funding in order to balance the state budget. This year there were no proposed Medicaid cuts as hospitals secured the first across-the-board rate increase in many years - \$134 million to increase reimbursement rates for labor & delivery service. The final state budget also prioritizes behavioral health, innovation, the critical role of rural hospitals, and the need to grow our health care workforce.

Agency for Health Care Administration Budget

- \$23.4 million to expand the Telehealth Minority Maternity Care Program

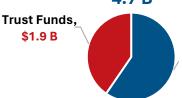
Department of Children & Families Budget

- \$21.5 million increase for community-based mental health and substance use services
- \$83.9 million to support the expansion of programs and services offered under the Opioid Settlement funding.
- **\$7.6 million** to increase payment rates for the Statewide Inpatient Psychiatric Program (SIPP)
- \$3 million to invest in electronic health records for mental health facilities.
- \$88.8 million to sustain and expand forensic bed capacity to support admissions to state mental health facilities
