
LEVERAGING FEDERAL MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT

The state of Florida has access to significant amounts of federal funding that is not currently being used. By leveraging federal Medicaid reimbursement for services currently administered through other programs, Florida could tap into hundreds of millions of Medicaid federal matching funds. Accessing this funding does not require expanding current Medicaid eligibility and will allow Florida to better care for the 5 million low-income Floridians who are currently served through this vital safety net program.

CURRENT STATUS

Medicaid-covered patients are receiving Medicaid-covered services outside of the Medicaid program. Instead, providers are reimbursed through state General Revenue leaving millions of federal funds on the table. State Agencies should capitalize by supporting these individuals with Medicaid funding, bringing additional dollars to our state.
